

Twitter

- In the top menu, tap your profile icon, then tap Settings and privacy.
- Tap Account, then tap Security.
- Tap Two-factor authentication.
- There are two methods to choose from: *Text message or Authentication app.*

To sign up via text message:

- Tap the slider next to Text message. Read the overview instructions, then tap Next. Enter your password, then tap Verify.
- *Note: If you don't already have a phone number associated with your account, we'll prompt you to enter it. Additionally you can choose to deselect the option to allow your existing contacts to find you on Twitter.*
- Now we'll ask you to enter the confirmation code we sent you via text message. Type or paste in the code, You'll see a confirmation screen with a backup code. We recommend you store a screenshot of the code in case you need it for future use. This will help you access your account if you lose your mobile phone or change your phone number.
- Tap Got it when you're finished with this screen.

Yahoo

- Sign in and go to your Account security page.
- Beside "Two-step verification," click the Toggle button to turn it on
- Enter your mobile number
- Click Send SMS or Call me to get a verification code
- Enter the verification code, then click Verify.

WhatsApp

- Open the WhatsApp app on your phone
- Tap the three dots in the upper-right corner
- Tap **Settings**
- Tap **Account**
- Tap **Two-step verification**
- Tap **Enable**
- Enter your custom PIN
- Re-enter your custom Pin
- Tap **Next**
- Enter your email address
- Re-enter your email address
- Tap **Save**
- Tap **Done**

Gmail

- Access Google 2-Step Verification.
- Click Get Started
- On the 2-Step Verification page, click Get Started
- Sign into the applicable Gmail account.
- Click to turn on 2 step verification.
Note: If the Turn Off button is present, 2-Step Verification is already enabled.
- Input the applicable phone number in the Voice or Text Message option.
Note: This number will be used to receive a numeric code from Google needed to authorize access to Outreach and other 3rd party apps that may be used in the future.
- Click Send Code.
- Enter the verification code sent from Google and click done
- Check the Trust this computer option as applicable.
- Click Next and click Confirm

You can turn on Two factor on other platforms not listed here.

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Two-factor Authentication

"Is this really you?" is the question Two-Factor Authentication asks whenever you want to log in to your online accounts.

Two-Factor Authentication doesn't give you access just because the username and the password are correct; it goes the extra length to demand for something else.



If 2FA is activated on an online account; be it email, social media or mobile apps; logging in requires a code which would be sent to your device as a text message or an email or to an Authenticator app.

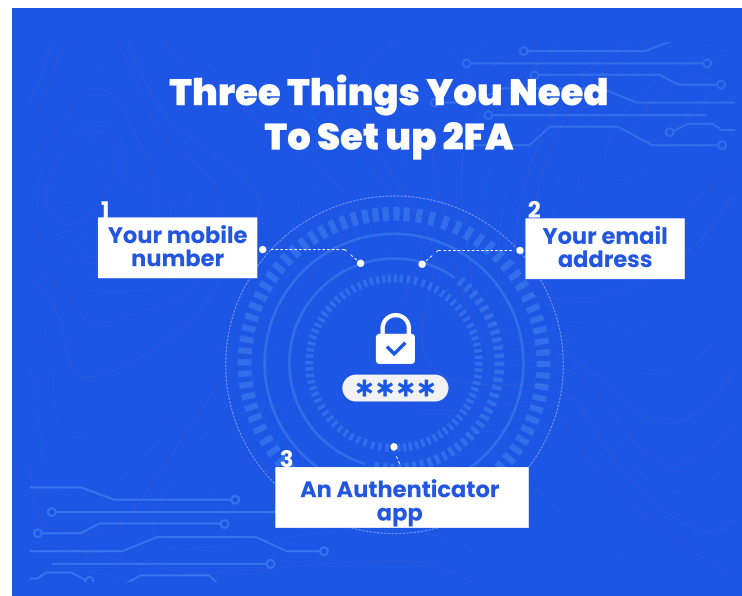
Once this is activated, only you can have access to your account even if your login details are compromised. It's free to set up, it improves your security, protects your data and protects you from identity theft.

Authenticator Apps

Have you ever heard of an Authenticator app? It's an app that helps you complete your two-factor authentication process by generating passcodes. The app isn't connected to your phone number so it's one of the topmost and highly recommended way to go about activating 2FA

An example of an Authenticator app is the Google Authenticator (available on play store and iOS App Store)



You can set up 2FA everywhere.

Let me guide you through turning on Two factor authentication on a few platforms

Facebook

- Login into your Facebook account
- Go to settings and privacy
- Click on settings
- Scroll down and click on Security and login
- Click on use two-factor authentication
- Choose Text message (SMS) and click continue
- Enter your phone number and click confirm
- Enter your password to confirm it is you
- Enter the code sent to you
- You will then see a confirmation screen

Instagram

- Tap @ or your profile picture in the bottom right to go to your profile.
- Tap ≡ in the top right, then tap ⚙ Settings.
- Tap **Security** and then scroll down and tap **Two-Factor Authentication**.
- Tap **Get started**
- Tap ☐ next to Text message, then insert the code and tap nex

Outlook

- Go to the Security basics page and sign in with your Microsoft account.
- Select **More security options**.
- Under **Two-step verification**, choose **Set up two-step verification** to turn it on, or choose **Turn off two-step verification** to turn it off.
- Follow the instructions.
